

SpineTRACK™ Registry

Qualified Clinical Data Registry (QCDR) services



The SpineTRACK Registry is designated as a QCDR by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) for the 2020 performance year.

What does this mean?

As required by the Quality Payment Program (QPP), SpineTRACK can submit quality data directly to CMS for the Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) on behalf of eligible clinicians participating/actively enrolling patients in the SpineTRACK Registry.

Why is this important?

The QPP impacts how Medicare pays eligible clinicians. Your utilization of SpineTRACK for the 2020 performance year can help meet Medicare reporting requirements and help you to qualify for higher payments and avoid a negative payment adjustment in 2022.

2020 MIPS performance

SpineTRACK allows you to collect and report patient-reported measures, independent of your electronic medical records, to meet 45% of the MIPS performance score. Each category is weighted and factored into a final MIPS score which affects Medicare payments in 2022 for the 2020 performance year, ±9% depending on participation.

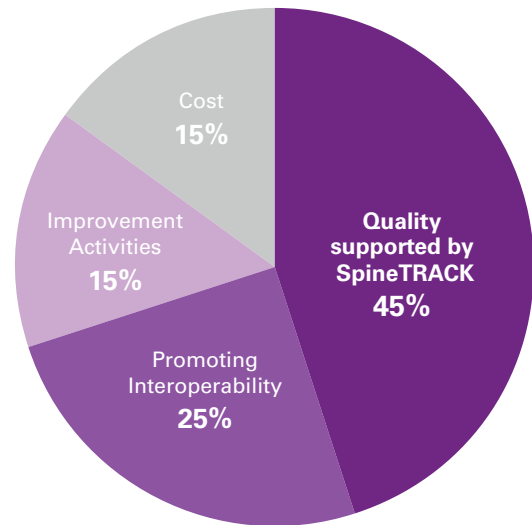

2020 MIPS performance category weights

Do I qualify?*

All eligible clinicians must meet the following low volume threshold determination:

Bill **> \$90,000 a year** for Medicare Part B covered professional services

+

Furnish covered professional services to **> 200 Medicare Part B beneficiaries a year**

+

Provide **> 200 covered professional services** to Medicare Part B patients (either as an individual or as a collective group)

Supported measures

QCDR measures

- Percent of patients meeting substantial clinical benefit (SCB) thresholds for back or neck pain
- Percent of patients meeting SCB thresholds for leg or arm pain
- Percent of patients meeting SCB thresholds for pain-related disability, including neck disability index (NDI) and Oswestry disability index (ODI)
- Quality of Life—physical health outcomes by Oberd
- Unplanned hospital readmission following spinal fusion surgery
- Elimination of narcotic medication use following spinal fusion surgery
- Infection in spinal fusion surgery
- Patient satisfaction following spinal fusion surgery

Required for participation

To meet 2020 reporting requirements, SpineTRACK participants must collect patient-reported outcomes, specifically NDI/ODI, visual analog scale, and PROMIS Global 10 within SpineTRACK on all patients, not just Medicare patients. All SpineTRACK users are required to sign a business associate agreement and a registry participation agreement for implementation. There is no additional cost for QCDR reporting services.
